**Discovering the Federal
Scholarship Tax Credit Program**





A National Catholic Opportunity

On July 4, 2025, a new federal scholarship tax credit program was signed into law that creates an unprecedented opportunity to empower families to access Catholic education for their children. Beginning in 2027, this tax credit has the potential to generate billions of dollars in private scholarships that could expand Catholic education in all 50 states.

How It Works



\$1,700 Federal Tax Credit: Taxpayers can claim a 100% non-refundable federal tax credit for donations to approved Scholarship Granting Organizations (SGOs).



State Opt-In Required: Governors of every state must opt-in to the federal scholarship tax credit program in order for students in that state to benefit.



Flexible Use of Scholarships: Scholarships can be used for tuition, tutoring, special needs services, technology, and educational supplies, among other eligible uses.



Scholarship Eligibility: Eligibility up to 300% of regional median income - more than 90% of households - are eligible to receive scholarships.

Preparing the Catholic Community
